

Operation, maintenance, and capital improvement for Central Otago District Council water and wastewater facilities



TRILITY is responsible for the operations, maintenance, and management of asset renewals for 15 water and wastewater treatment plants, as well as associated intakes, outfalls, raw water mains reservoirs, pump stations, and rising mains.



TRILITY was awarded the water services facilities contract with the Central Otago District Council (CODC) on the South Island of New Zealand in 2025. TRILITY manages the facilities to deliver services for the operations, maintenance, and management of asset renewals for 15 water and wastewater treatment plants, as well as associated reservoirs, pump stations, and rising mains, on behalf of CODC.

The CODC contract includes water and wastewater treatment facilities across Central Otago providing essential services to Clyde, Cromwell, Roxburgh, Naseby, Omakau/Ophir, Patearoa, Pisa Village, Ranfurly, and Roxburgh towns and surrounding areas. The contract also includes management of the associated water and wastewater rising mains, 40 pump stations, and reservoirs that support communities throughout the region.

TRILITY manages the facilities in compliance within the increasingly complex New Zealand regulatory environment for drinking water compliance and wastewater treatment in an area with rapidly growing populations and significant seasonal tourism uplifts.



Who

Central Otago District Council (CODC) is the local authority for Central Otago. Their role is to help build local community capability through the services and activities provided on behalf of the community. CODC provide utilities such as water, waste water and storm water, waste minimisation, roading, elderly persons' housing, community facilities and other property services.

What

Operations and Maintenance of 15 water and wastewater facilities, pumping stations and minor capital upgrades.

Where

Central Otago is located in the heart of New Zealand's South Island and sits east of Queenstown and west of sweeping Canterbury plains. Idyllic landscapes - striking mountain ranges and golden tussock fields abound with wineries and orchards through the charming historic towns.

Why

To ensure safe drinking water and wastewater treatment within the increasingly complex regulatory environment. To enhance asset and maintenance planning to ensure the long-term sustainability of the assets and value for CODC's customers. The contract will further strengthen the delivery of essential water services across Central Otago and its communities.
